- II. Slavery: The Bible does not encourage slavery; it regulates it.
  - A. Old Testament:
    - 1. Non-Jews: Leviticus 25:44-46
    - 2. Jews could sell themselves into slavery, BUT Exodus 21:1
    - 3. Even then, slaves had rights. Exodus 21:26-27 --
    - 4. <u>Deuteronomy 23:15</u> If a runaway slave comes to you...
