

## August Vestry Minutes Sunday \* August 20, 2023 \* 2pm

Present: Rector Tom Rutherford, Senior Warden Ron Lancioni, Junior Warden Mike King, Marci Babione, Steve Borst, Anida Daniel, Joyce Taylor, Lionel Williams, and Sarah Wolfe; and Treasurer Bob Tate and Apprentice Rector Andrew Lazo.

Absent: Beth Ann Carr (with family).

I. <u>FORMATION</u>: Marci Babione leads Noonday Prayer. Based on 1 Corinthians 12:12-27, Tom Rutherford will talk about how the Messiah's Way helps the Messiah family be a healthy Body of Christ, and he will ask us, "Which parts of our parish body are doing their parts well? Which parts of our parish body are not doing as well, or are missing?" So we can pray for the Lord to raise up people to fill those gaps.

#### II. INFORMATION:

A. Vestry Ministry Team Reports: None submitted

#### A. Staff Reports:

1. **Children of the Messiah Preschool:** The Financial Report is the same as last month's, since the preschool was closed until this week. We lost 3 families to the brand new 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Preschool at Main and Newell Streets, but most classes are full, and several have waiting lists.

#### 2. Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

- a) It has been a wild ride in Children's Ministry over the summer! We had several day camps, with our highest numbers ever in attendance. While they were fantastic opportunities for outreach, fellowship, and fun, they also served as a reminder of how much we need volunteers in this area! I had a new "volunteer" at Edible Science camp, and she was amazing! The only downfall, she is 12... While helpful in many ways and a delight to be around, she does not count as an extra adult. Especially when there were participants in the camp her age. I am encouraging her to continue to volunteer and I will put her with younger children. The great news is that she had such a blast, her older brother would like to volunteer as well. So, for my fall camp, I have 2 youth volunteers lined up.
- b) The themes for our camps were Let's a Gogh, Mario and Van Gogh mash-up art camp. We painted Van Gogh style, learned about him, and made several Mario-themed crafts. We ate pizza, played Mario games on the Switch, played Mario Bro. Monopoly, and made a Super Daddio Fa ther's Day card for our dads.
- c) We had retro camp, with an 80's vibe. Unfortunately, the AC was out that day and we could not do some of our activities like Shrinky dinks, and baking cookies and pizza. We had water fights, watch Bob Ross and did some watercolor art, ate McDonald's happy meals, made plastic canvas art, played 4 square, 4 corners, heads up 7 up. We played outside and then cooled off with Bomb pops. We also played a lot of patty-cake games like Lemonade and Miss Mary Mack.
- d) We had Winnie the Pooh cooking camp. We always make 3 meals and 2 snacks. The kids get to take home dinner and dessert. We made Pooh and friend puffball crafts, had a drawing contest, and talked about life lessons we can learn from each of the friends in the 100 Acre woods.
- e) Our final camp was Edible Science. We started out with intergalactic doughnuts and milk. Then we divided into groups to build solar ovens. We assembled s'mores and found the sunniest places on campus to place our oven. We made butter in a jar, bread in a bag, ice cream in a bag and 2 kinds of edible slime. We also made hard candy geodes. Every experiment we made; we ate! We watched an episode of Bill Nye on Atoms and an episode of the Magic school bus on saving bees!

- g) Beginning August 6, I changed the Children's Church curriculum. Some of the content was getting a bit cheesy and taking away from the message so I switched to something cheaper, but more labor intensive to adapt. I am waiting for a program I am interested in to appear in December, then I will do a trial run of that on our kids to see how it fits. For our back-to-school Sunday we talked about packing our spiritual backpacks and what virtues we should clothe ourselves in every day. We discussed Joseph and his coat of many colors—had multicolored popcorn for a treat and received a new tag for our backpacks that had been prayed over.
- h) SHINE Kids' Club is taking a break for a month. With so many of our kids being on vacation and weekends away it was hard to stick to a plan. And where there is no plan, there is chaos! I am making some changes and seeking some extra adult hands to serve from 4:30-6 on Sundays. We will kick off again on September 10 with Games, Goodies and Grandparents night!
- 3. **Facility Minister** Soner Alexandre is learning the job and overseeing our new Maintenance Minister, Yolwenn Alexandre.
- 4. **Messiah School for the Arts** has closed, due to a lack of anyone to lead it. We need volunteers to help clean it out and give input so we can re-examine the space and the best ways to use it?
- 5. Music Minister Sergei Kossenko reports:
- a) I started as Music Minister on July 16.
- b) Father Andrew Lazo has been teaching me Anglican history and liturgy.
- c) Former Music Minister Linda Ellison and Father Tom are also mentoring me on planning music.
- d) I planned and performed the service music for the Wednesday morning Communions during Father Tom's trip to the Holy Land.
- e) The choir is on summer recess until September, so no choir rehearsals were held.
- f) The Worship Bands' rehearsals were held at regularly appointed times.
- g) The Office Angels are compiling a database of the hymns and songs the Messiah family know and like, which will help me plan music that will be meaningful for the family.

#### **6. Office Minister** Julie Altenbach reports:

- a) Along with Fr. Andrew and Angela Lopez, I attended an event at Advent Health and heard from representatives from various non-profit organizations in our area that can provide services and resources.
- b) I prepped for services while I was away for 14 days in the Holy Land. I am grateful for the Office Angels and staff that took care of everything so I could be away. The trip was amazing, and I am happy to share about my experiences with anyone who wants to hear about the closeness I felt with God and the Messiah folks who went on the trip.
- c) I met with a representative from Church Pension for insurance purposes.
- d) I continue to plan for Angela Lopez's ordination to the Diaconate and reception on August 30<sup>th</sup>.
- e) Angela Lopez and I provided lunch during pre-planning for our preschool teachers.
- f) I ordered new handicapped parking signs, as the old ones were crumbling.

#### 7. Tech Minister Vita Mazzaluna reports:

a) I am covering the livestream sound monitoring/adjustment at each Sunday 9:30 am service. I have covered this duty approximately once per month while Jeremy took his monthly service music shift but covering weekly is quickly allowing me to better "get" how the sound management works. Definitely a work in progress as sound is not my strong suit at all! Osni Alexandre has been very helpful since he has been managing the house sound for the 9:30 am, 11 am, and 4pm services for several years now. Hoping to work with Music Minister Sergei Kossenko to iron out our sound needs over the next couple of weeks.

- b) Helped cover some of the cross-over duties for Office Minister Julie Altenbach while she participated in the Holy Land pilgrimage.
- c) Recorded, edited, and inserted a commercial by Janice Hull for Ladies' Dining.
- d) With Office Minister Julie Altenbach, helped Parishioner Katherine Reusch do a first run of Staff Photos and a small group of parishioner photos for the photo directory. We will move forward with more scheduling soon!
- e) Continuing to supervise Tech Intern Yolwenn Alexandre. She is now serving as an additional weekly slides "checker" so that she learns the formatting and can serve as backup if ever needed. She is doing great!
- f) Continued to produce other specialty multimedia content as needed.
- g) Setup Music Minister Sergei Kossenko's laptop with necessary software and access (Google Drive, Office 365, various share access).
- h) Created several additional "How To" documents for sound management, including app setup on new devices.
- 8. (Interim) Youth Minister Tom Rutherford is meeting with ACTIVATE on Sundays. He's negotiated with Father Soner to start ACTIVATE at 5pm, so the Haitian teens don't miss church. He's polled the teens to see what topics and activities they're interested in, and he's begun focusing the weekly meetings on the topics they chose. He's also still praying and looking for whom the Lord might have to lead that group... not in a hurry to hire anyone, since we have such a large financial deficit.
- C. **Angela Lopez will be ordained a deacon** here on Wednesday August 30 at 7pm. This will increase the retirement benefits we pay her to 18% of her compensation, starting September 1.

#### **III. DISCUSSION:**

A. Classroom Building Air Conditioner: The air handler, which was installed when we renovated that building in 1998, is on its last legs. Coolant technology has changed, so we can't replace only the air handler; we'd have to replace that and the outside units. R&R A/C, who takes care of all of our A/C, except the chiller for the Parish Hall patched it together as a temporary fix, and they are researching to tell us our options to replace the entire system. Those numbers will be reported as soon as they come in.

#### IV. **DECISIONS**:

- A. **Video Cameras for the Preschool area**: Director Barbara Ellerbe would like to have cameras, and got a bid to procure them and have them installed. It's \$3,102.56, which the preschool will pay, if we approve their getting the cameras. The vestry approved the request to move forward with this project to purchase the camera system.
- B. **HVAC Controls:** In June we decided to spend \$52,445 to upgrade the entire control system, pending finding out the amounts in the Building Fund, and if there's plenty to do this capital improvement. Last month we decided to pay for it from \$26,598.81 in "Memorials" and from our Investment accounts.
- C. After that meeting, however, Office Minister Julie Altenbach and Finance Minister Jane Cartelli urged us to seek another bid for the job, because CES has been slow in providing numbers and bids and profoundly poor in communication and customer service. They no-showed for 2 appointments with Julie and Junior Warden Mike King, and, when the service guy showed up for the regularly scheduled maintenance, he told Julie, "I don't know why I'm here."
- D. Before we drop \$52,000 and tie ourselves to them for the next 10 years, Tom Rutherford called several other pastors to see what A/C companies they use, and several A/C companies to get bids for the same scope of work which he's discovered is quite specialized, and not every A/C company does chiller plant controls.

- E. 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Winter Garden has done several major construction projects and have a campus bigger than ours, and they recommend Apple Air here in Winter Garden. Tom called them, and their guy came out this past Thursday to see what we have and to determine what we need. He will report to Tom when they have a proposal.
- F. Tom recommends waiting until we hear from Apple before proceeding. The vestry agreed to wait before moving forward.

#### **V. MEETING MINUTES & FINANCIAL REPORT:**

- A. Minutes from the last month's meeting: APPROVED
- B. Financial Report from Treasurer Bob Tate: APPROVED
- 1. Operating Income last month was LESS than expenses, INCREASING our year-to date DEFICIT \$96,703.60. PLEASE PRAY.
- 2. Building Fund Income was LESS than we needed to pay the \$11,996.00 mortgage and other expenses, turning our year-to-date SURPLUS to a DEFICIT of \$1,476.43. PLEASE PRAY!

The meeting closed in prayer and adjourned at 3:00 pm.



Book Reviews

In looking over what I wrote last month, I discovered a slight mistake. I said the title of the book I intended to read was *Think Small*. Actually, the title is *Dream Small: The Secret Power of the Ordinary Christian Life* by Seth Lewis. Basically, it's an excellent book, the only problem being that the author seems to think that if saying a thing once is a good thing, saying it 50 times is even better. But his basic idea is

excellent, which can be summed up in a few sentences:

- 1. Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness. Everything else will perish and therefore pales in comparison. He also points out that this can and should be our focus regardless of where we are on mankind's ladder of success."
- 2. God doesn't use the same measuring tape that we do to measure success. He cites the time Voyager 1 took a picture of the earth, and it looked like a speck of dust in a sunbeam!
- If that is true of our planet, how tiny are we? How small our "big dreams" seem in that light! And yet our Creator loves us so much that He became one of us in order to make it possible for us to spend eternity with Him.
- 3. Our focus should be giving others a hand up instead of on our own climbing the human ladder of success.
- 4. Those whom human society deems worthless are immeasurably precious to God. (All of us are.)
- 5. Because of this, we don't have to chase the wild goose of achieving value for ourselves—we are already valued by God.

I personally relate a lot to that last one. As a teenager, I couldn't figure out why God had bothered to create me, so I worked hard at academics and music to justify my existence; but it didn't work. Part of it was that I was trying to be Bob (my older brother), who always succeeded remarkably at whatever he tried. (Nobody else gave me this idea—it was my own foolishness.). Fortunately, when I went to college, God informed me that if He had wanted two Bobs, He would have created two Bobs—He wanted me to be me! And if He had never created me, there would be a me-shaped hole in His universe. And the same is true of everyone.

I think you will find this encouraging and inspiring.




