

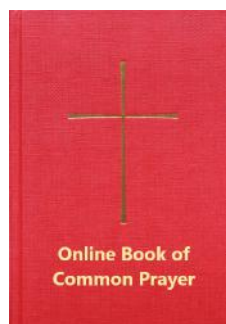

His serving in all those venues gives him valuable experience in a wide range of settings, AND it blesses the people and parishes he serves... just as he's blessed us for the past year and a half.

And we are profoundly honored to share them with the wider Church.

September Vestry Minutes

Sunday * October 15, 2023 * 2pm

Present: Rector Tom Rutherford, Junior Warden Mike King, Marci Babione, Steve Borst, Beth Ann Carr, Anida Daniel, Mildred Dubic, Mary Kay Predmore, Sandy Sparks, Joyce Taylor, Lionel Williams, and Sarah Wolfe; and Treasurer Bob Tate.

Absent: Senior Warden Ron Lancioni (family trip)

I. **FORMATION:** Lionel Williams led Noonday Prayer.

- A. Based on 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and our Guidelines for Vestry membership, Tom Rutherford talked about the qualities we're looking for in potential Vestry nominees, and asked who comes to mind as we consider those qualities. Tom will invite them to attend next month's meeting to see how we operate and to help them decide whether or not to offer themselves as a living sacrifice.
- B. Those Guidelines are:
 - 1. Be active members of Church of the Messiah.
 - 2. Be growing in their own faith, living the promises we make in our Baptismal Covenant (Book of Common Prayer, page 304), which are to:
 - a) Continue in the apostles' teaching (Bible study) and fellowship (regular worship attendance), the breaking of bread (Holy Communion), and in the prayers.
 - b) Resist evil, and whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord
 - c) Proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ.
 - d) Seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself.
 - e) Strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being.
 - 3. Tithe to God through the Church and/or other charities, OR be on a deliberate plan of increasing the proportion of income given to God, so that they will be tithing by the end of their vestry term.
 - 4. Be available for monthly Vestry meetings and the In-House Vestry Retreat, which will be Friday evening and Saturday morning through lunch, February 9-10, 2024.
 - 5. Be willing to recruit a team to oversee a particular area of ministry.
 - 6. Be willing to do 2 months of Door Duty opening up or closing down the campus on Sundays.

II. **INFORMATION:**

A. Vestry Ministry Team Reports:

1. Outreach: Doreen Stachowski reports:

- a) We will have Thanksgiving baskets for those in need this year and will have a "food request" board up by November 5th or earlier. A gift card will be added for the turkey. All food items due by November 19th. Angela is working with Father Tom on the families in need this year and will also inquire with Dillard Street School.
- b) The same for Christmas - the board will be up by December 3rd and items due by December 17th. A gift card will be added for the Ham.
- c) The Outreach team is in agreement to get Disney tickets for the children at Edgewood Childrens Ranch. We are researching ways to get a grant so we can assist with food, parking, and miscellaneous items for them. Beth Ann and Doreen visited the Ranch and discussed our options with the Director. Beth Ann contacted the Disney CEO's Administrative Assistant first, and we are waiting to hear 2 back. Our second option is to complete an application to Disney in Edgewood's name and have them send it in for consideration. Lastly, if all else fails, we will buy tickets from our 2023 budget at a discounted rate for student groups.
- d) Beth contacted Costco to try and get the turkeys and ham for the holidays. Instead, they gave us a \$100 gift card.

2. No others submitted

- 1. **Children of the Messiah Preschool:** The Financial Report was emailed separately. The surveillance cameras are installed and working. Director Barbara Ellerbe had major neurosurgery and is out recovering for up to 6 weeks. The Preschool teachers are covering well.

B. Staff Reports:

2. **Children's Minister** Deacon Angela Lopez reports:

a) Everything is going well in Children's Ministry. SHINE Kids Club has resumed, and we are enjoying a series called Pumpkin Seeds of Prayer. We started the unit off by planting some seeds as a group to grow some flowers. We looked at mustard seeds and how they grow into large plants, and we talked about faith and how our relationship with Jesus grows when we tend to it like a plant. We had sunflower seeds for a treat. Each week we are looking at a Bible Hero who had a prayer answered in a big way and are being reminded when we have faith as tiny as a mustard seed, great things will happen.

b) Shine Kids are looking forward to providing Simple Supper this month and having a camp day where we will talk about remembering and honoring the Saints who have gone on to glory. We will make crafts and all of our meals based on the Disney/Pixar movie Coco.

c) In Children's Church, we are learning about everyday heroes and how they honor God through their work. We have learned about police and healthcare workers so far. The kids are working on memorizing Colossians 3:23 (Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters.), one of my personal favorites.

d) I have submitted my budget request for 2024 and it includes an increase to cover a really fantastic curriculum I have been looking into. The previous one I used was getting a bit "cheesy" according to the kids and was becoming a distraction. The version of Dig In I would like is being released in November. It will lead kids to walk in Jesus' footsteps from birth through resurrection and ascension. In the meantime, I am working with some new units I am adapting from the Sunday School store. They are fairly well written and easy to adapt to our time and format.

3. **Office Minister** Julie Altenbach reports:

a) The Office Angels and I continue to input Messiah's Way packets. We are using this time to work with Joyce Taylor and Katherine Reusch to ensure all the contact information is up to date with our system and the directory.

b) The Office Angels have been busy calling the parishioners who haven't had an opportunity to have their picture taken for our Parish Directory.

c) I have spent the last couple of weeks adjusting to my new dual role as Office Minister and Archdeacon. The Office Angels have been amazing in making sure there is always someone at the desk to greet folks and that a live person answers the phone. On the rare occasion an Office Angel has to step away from the front desk, the phone transfers to my cell phone so people calling Church of the Messiah talk to someone instead of a machine, even when I am at the Diocesan Office.

d) The DOK and lots of Office Angels and other folks helped set up and serve at the reception and ordination of Angel Lopez. I prepared the bulletin and made sure everything was ready. It was a great day for our Parish Family

4. **Tech Minister** Vita Mazzaluna reports:

a) The tablet computer to run the livestream sound provided by parishioner Ginger Sirola has been all set-up and is working very well. Thank you so much, Ginger!!!

b) I am going to be training one of my tech volunteers and intern Yolwenn Alexandre on livestream sound management so that I can have a backup in the event I am unable to be at a 9:30am service.

c) Worked with Jeremy Adams to get our Amazon data storage account root user switched to media@churchofthemessiah.com so that it is not tied to a specific person. The credit card on file is my COTM card.

- d) Helped setup and execute Deacon Angela Lopez's Ordination livestream with Osni Alexandre managing the stream as well as sound.
- e) Provided various tech support in person and via phone to other staff members several times (I love that part of my job!).
- f) Spoke with Fr. Tom about getting "on the list" for lift rental projects so that we can run hard wire cabling across the Sanctuary in the same fashion as what is run in the Parish Hall for the Projector. Currently we are on a wifi setup and having it hard wired with the wifi as backup would be a better scenario.

5. (Interim) Youth Minister Tom Rutherford reports: ACTIVATE is meeting every Sunday afternoon. They provided Sunday Supper on September 24.

C. Diocesan Convention Delegates: Convention is Saturday, January 27 at All Saints' Church in Winter Park. In addition to all our Clergy, we have 3 Lay Delegates and 3 Alternate Lay Delegates. At least one of our Lay Delegates needs to be a Vestry member. Beth Ann Carr, Mildred Dubic, Mary Kay Predmore, and Lionel Williams volunteered to be delegates. Tom Rutherford will recruit 2 more Alternate Delegates.

D. III. DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month):

A. Classroom Building Air Conditioner: The air handler, which was installed when we renovated that building in 1998, is on its last legs. Coolant technology has changed, so we can't replace only the air handler; we'd have to replace that and the outside units. Plus, governmental regulations have changed: we have a 2-phase unit, and now we're required to have a 3-phase unit, which means we have to add another wire for added electrical capacity. R&R A/C, who takes care of all of our A/C, except the chiller for the Parish Hall patched it together as a temporary fix, and they are researching to tell us our options to replace the entire system, including the cost of upgrading the electrical service to that building. Those numbers will be reported as soon as they come in.

B. Steve Borst submitted his application to the Diocese to begin the process toward ordination as a Deacon. The next step in that process is for the Rector and Vestry to Endorse him. Steve told us about his sense of call and answered the questions we had for him. The vestry will have the chance to sign his endorsement at next month's meeting.

C. 2024 Budget: Bob Tate gave us the 1st Draft WISH Budget for a first look. In addition to our seeing it, the Finance Committee will look it over and give us their recommendations at our November meeting. Tom Rutherford made several proposals about Staff and Payroll that increase several staff positions and compensation, but with Office Minister Julie Altenbach's going to half-time, still saves us \$8,000.

IV. DECISIONS: HVAC Controls: The vestry agreed to contract with Automated Mechanical Services to upgrade our HVAC controls and system. We will use the funds from Memorials to pay half of the expense and pay the rest from our investment accounts.

V. MEETING MINUTES & FINANCIAL REPORT:

A. Minutes from the last month's meeting: APPROVED.

B. Financial Report from Treasurer Bob Tate: APPROVED.

1. Operating Income last month was LESS than expenses, INCREASING our year-to-date DEFICIT to \$138,951.85. PLEASE PRAY!

2. Building Fund Income was LESS than needed to pay the \$11,996.00 mortgage and other expenses, INCREASING our year-to-date DEFICIT to \$12,463.59. PRAY.

Meeting closed with prayer and adjourned at 3:30

Where in the World is Fr. Andrew?

First of all, let me assure you: yes, I still work at Church of the Messiah (and I love it more than ever!). I've been gone a lot lately for a couple reasons.

First, as a former schoolteacher, I haven't been all that used to managing vacation time because we had summers off. By the time I realized I had left most of my vacation time for the second half of the year, I had to scramble some to fit it all in—won't make that mistake again!

So a few weeks ago, Christin and I went to Chicago for several days to spend time with some dear friends, and to visit the Marion E. Wade Center, the C. S. Lewis archive. 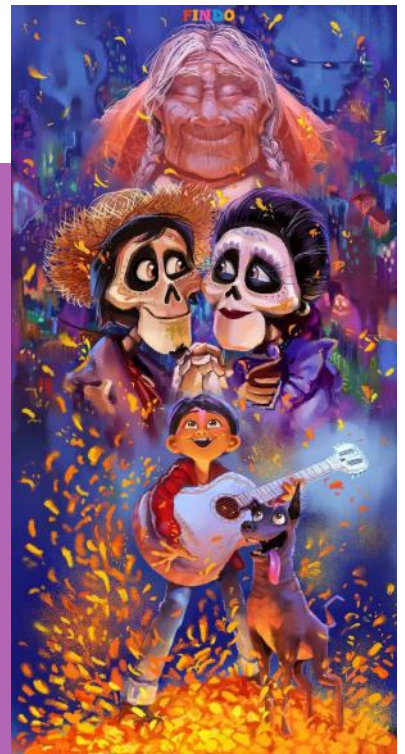


We had a Coco themed day and on the menu was:
